### **Implementing Strategies (Community Survey, Participative Mechanisms)**

A Village survey and Baseline House hold survey was conducted in the Cluster villages: Kutladampatti, and Ramayanpatti, at Vadipatti Taluk, Madurai District as a part of “Unnat Bharat Abhiyan” program. From our college, 15 students participated and collected the information from the adopted villages under the guidance of the UBA coordinators, with the cooperation of village presidents and people.

The faculties who took students' attendance and also briefed them about the procedures of data collection as it would help the students to smoothen the survey process. A group of students led by college faculty started the survey in and around the exterior part of the villages while the interior part of the villages were covered by two other students' groups. The students were able to interact and collect the necessary details and the overall experience of the survey has been good from student perspective.

The main purpose of the Rally is to spread the message to avoid a one-time use and throw away the plastics as per the instructions given as Biodegradable Trash by the Tamilnadu Government. Through this Rally, village people were made aware about the ill effects of plastic usage.

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
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## OUTCOME:

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


The objective of the training was to equip village self-help group members with the knowledge and skills required to manufacture lite chemical products, such as cleaning agents, disinfectants, and air fresheners.

#### TRAINING CONTENT:

1. Introduction to lite chemical products and their market demand
2. Raw materials and equipment required for manufacturing
3. Manufacturing process and quality control measures
4. Packaging and labelling requirements
5. Marketing and sales strategies
6. Safety precautions and handling of chemicals

#### TRAINING METHODOLOGY:

1. Theory sessions with presentations and demonstrations
2. Practical sessions where participants manufactured lite chemical products
3. Interactive sessions with Q&A and group discussions

#### FEEDBACK:

Participants provided positive feedback on the training program, citing that it was informative, interactive, and practical. They appreciated the hands-on experience and the opportunity to clarify their doubts.




